1. Aristotle University of Thessaloniki:

Courses at Aristotle University of Thessaloniki are normally taught in Greek. International staff will be assisted by the Welcome Office: welcomecenter.uni-wuerzburg.de/en Incoming students must select the whole subject on their Learning Agreements. It is not possible to take only one or a selective part of the subjects, with exception of a clinical practice. The exams will be for the complete subject. It is compulsory to take part in the written exam for each subject (exception: clinical practice).

Würzburg Faculty of Medicine can try to arrange clinical practices upon request. Respective inquiries must be placed 1 year prior arrival. The rooms at the student residences must be rented for the complete semester period (October – March, April – September). Due to a lack of private accommodation possibilities incoming students are requested to adapt the length of their stays to the room rental periods at the student residences.

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After having received the paper application (printed online application) the letter of admission will be sent within a max, of six weeks.

3. A Transcript of Records will be issued by the receiving institution no later than 5 weeks after the assessment period has finished at the receiving HEI.

4. Termination of the agreement

In the event of unilateral termination, a notice of at least one academic year should be given. This means that a unilateral decision to discontinue the exchanges notified to the other party by 1 September 20XX will only take effect as of 1 September 20XX+1. The termination clauses must include the following disclaimer: "Neither the European Commission nor the National Agencies can be held responsible in case of a conflict."
