Institutional actions to support Academic Freedom

- The University of Tartu (UT) upholds academic freedom as one of its core values: https://ut.ee/en/values-and-responsibility
- The University is signatory to the Magna Charta Universitatum (1988)
- The UT Senate has adopted the Code of Conduct for Research Integrity (October 2017) and instructions for applying the Code (January 2020).
- A quote from the introduction to the latter document:

Science and art and their teaching in Estonia are free, and universities and research institutions are autonomous within the limits prescribed by the law (Constitution of the Republic of Estonia), but the freedom is not absolute. It is limited by responsibility to people, society, natural and cultural environment. Taking responsibility is the precondition that ensures the society's trust in research.

UT's support to Students and Scholars at Risk

- Under the Estonian Research Council's Ukrainian support measure, **9 temporary academic positions (up to 6 months)** have been created at UT, majority of them in the Faculty of Science and Technology and in the Faculty of Social Sciences.
- In addition, 3 Ukrainian researchers have joined UT staff via MSCA4Ukraine.
- The University of Tartu Ukraine Centre (UTUC) established in 2023 to pool expertise and coordinate activities of UT and its partners in support of Ukraine.
- At the end of Feb 2022, the University of Tartu Foundation set up a scholarship fund for Ukrainian students to collect and channel donations to support the studies of Ukrainian students. Several fundraising and charity events have been organised to raise money for the fund. Since 2022, UT Ukrainian Scholarship Fund has offered financial support to 245 students in the amount of €178,700.
- Since 2022, a total of **297 Ukrainians** have been enrolled **in degree programmes**, of whom 192 started their studies in autumn 2022 on state-funded study places.
