Nomination & Application Deadlines	
Autumn Semester	Deadline Nomination for the home university: <u>1 May</u> Deadline Application to the VUB for the student: <u>1 June</u>
Spring Semester	Deadline Nomination for the home university: <u>1 October</u> Deadline Application to the VUB for the student: <u>1 November</u>
Nomination procedure	<p>The home university nominates students for exchange under Erasmus+, EBelgica (BE) and SEMP at VUB through the following link: https://forms.office.com/e/2pNWyyxp9</p> <p>! For the study fields of: Law and Criminology, Pharmacy, and Psychology please consult the additional nomination requirements in the factsheet.</p> <p>For any additional question, please contact us at exchange.incoming@vub.be.</p>
Application procedure	<p>After all nominations have been received and processed (by mid May), students receive directly from the VUB a link to register in the application system (Mobility Online).</p> <p>Completing the online application process before the deadline indicated above confirms the student's participation in the exchange programme.</p> <p>VUB issues an admission letter once the application process is completed. The selection of courses is the student's own responsibility.</p>
Legal requirements for non-EEA students with an EU residence permit for studies	<p>The procedure described below applies to exchange students with a non-EEA nationality who study and reside in another EU member state and who are in the possession of a residence permit for studies from that member state (not Belgium) valid for the entire period of their mobility to Belgium. Please note that the process can take up to 90 days and it must be submitted at the latest 60 days before the mobility starts.</p> <p>Full procedure available on our website.</p>
ECTS requirement	Incoming students are required to take a minimum of 21 ECTS (VUB courses) per semester.
Language requirements	All incoming exchange students have to provide proof of English language knowledge in their online application. This can be an official English test, proof of English-taught courses taken at the home university, or a statement from the home university confirming that you have sufficient knowledge of English to take English-taught courses at VUB. A minimum B2 level is recommended. The same level applies for those needing the Dutch and/or French language (during a traineeship at the university hospital, for example).

Certificate of arrival/ departure	<p>To avoid duplication of work, VUB will no longer sign external certificates of arrival and departures. All students will receive a VUB certificate signed and stamped.</p> <p>CoA/CoD are sent directly to the student and the person they indicated in the application tool as administrative contact.</p> <p>Should you have additional requests, please contact us directly. Students requests will be otherwise redirected to this policy.</p>
Transcript of Records (ToR)	<p>Incoming students' ToR will be issued shortly after finishing exams. Deliberation dates are available on our website</p> <p>VUB students' ToR is sent directly to the student and the person they indicated in the application tool as administrative contact after they have confirmed their departure in our application system (Mobility Online).</p>
Courses available in following disciplines:	<p>Course catalogue here.</p>
Restrictions for specific disciplines/ faculties	<p><u>Faculty of Social Sciences and Solvay Business School</u>: courses have a maximum capacity, and students will be accepted on a first come first served basis.</p> <p><u>Law & Criminology</u>: English taught courses are only available during the Fall semester of the academic year. For this reason, non-Dutch speaking students can only be nominated for the Fall semester and no prolongations are possible for these students.</p> <p><u>Pharmacy</u>: due to capacity limitations, nominations are on hold until we can guarantee a spot in the lab. The faculty can commit to providing an answer within 2 months from the nomination of the student. For this reason, we would advise to nominate the students for the Pharmacy study field as soon as possible.</p> <p><u>Psychology</u>: Due to practical reasons (e.g., certain courses have content that needs to be taught in Dutch or use course materials such as roleplaying exercises that are only available in Dutch), the study field of psychology has a list of courses in English and a list of so-called reading courses (study materials available in English but course itself</p>

	<p>is in Dutch). We recommend you to inform your incoming exchange students of this distinction so that they can keep it into account when drafting their Learning Agreement.</p> <p>Incoming students can also follow courses from the English Educational Sciences program in our faculty.</p>

The beginning of exchange activities	<p>The International Relations office welcomes all new international students on campus before the official start of classes. All information regarding VUB, schedules and procedures, as well as campus life and culture is presented. Students are welcome to ask questions regarding their stay at VUB, and get a campus tour. Dates of Orientation Days are mentioned in an email to students and will be available on the International Relations office's website.
