Exchange Students must have completed at least one academic year at the home university and be nominated by the sending partner institution.

### 2.1. Recommended language skills CAMPUS MAINZ

The sending institution, following the agreement with our institution, is responsible for providing support to its nominated candidates so that they can have the recommended language skills at the start of the study or teaching period.

Exchange students do not have to pass a formal language examination in German in order to qualify for enrollment at JGU. To be able to study successfully at JGU, your students must be able to understand the courses taught in German and/or English and take exams in German and/or English as well (depending on the language of instruction).

Please note that not all subjects offer English taught courses.

For these purposes, it would be best if they had an **intermediate (B2) level of German (and/or English) or at least a B1 level with a good final grade.**

\*\*\**The specific language requisite of **B2 for German Studies** is a requirement from the German Department to emphasize that German Studies is a philology (i.e. the study of German linguistics, literature and culture) and not a language learning programme. Thus, the students intending to study German Studies must have at least a **high B1** level overall and preferably a **B2** level to be able to follow the lessons successfully. But if your nominee's level of language proficiency is a special case, please feel free to contact us for an individual clarification. After all, we wish your students to feel comfortable in their courses and to study successfully at JGU. When applying to JGU, your students in the field of German Philology need to indicate their language proficiency in the online application form and to upload a confirmation for it. Students who come to JGU with B1 level, might have only limited access to courses in German Studies. **They don't need an official language test** to prove their knowledge. A statement by the coordinator/ a university teacher from the home university that they study German Studies and/ or have advanced B1 or preferably B2 level is sufficient to get admitted.*

The letters of admission are uploaded from mid-July to mid-September for the winter semester and from mid-January to mid-March for the summer semester

There is no general exam period. Exams are usually scheduled for the last week of classes or for the week that follows.

## 4. Learning Agreement and course registration CAMPUS GERMERSHEIM

The "responsible person" for Faculty 06 to be indicated in the Erasmus+ Learning Agreements is the respective **Erasmus+ coordinator**, see the [list of coordinators at Faculty 06](#).

Students will register for their courses during the first two lecture weeks through the International Office Germersheim (specific information for each term will be sent directly to the incoming students).

Due to the geographical situation of the Germersheim Campus (approx. 100 km south of Mainz) it is not possible to attend courses at other faculties of Johannes Gutenberg University.

Our grading system is based on a scale from 1,0 to 5,0. The minimum passing mark is 4,0.

1,0 to 1,3 – outstanding | 1,7 to 2,3 – good | 2,7 to 3,3 – regular | 3,7 to 4,0 – passed | 5,0 – suspense

In some courses no marks, but "passed" or "suspense" and the respective ECTS credits are given.

Students apply individually: Municipal student dormitory (Städtisches Studentenwohnheim), In der kleinen Au 2, 76726 Germersheim – one to three-room flats (17-58 m<sup>2</sup>): approx. 270-660 € Student dormitory of the Association for Student Affairs (Studierendenwerk), An der Hochschule 2, 76726 Germersheim – Single rooms and flats (12-22 m<sup>2</sup>): approx. 165-225 €

INDEPENDENT ROOM-HUNTING: The rent for rooms in shared flats is about 300-400 €/month; the rent for flats is about 400-500 €/month. List with room offers provided by the General Students' Committee (AStA).
