Recommended language skills

The sending institution, following agreement with the receiving institution, is responsible for providing support to its nominated candidates to help them acquire the recommended language skills by the start of the study or teaching period.

As a rule, the language of instruction is the institution's official language and/or English. This applies to both the sending and receiving institution.

The Philipps-Universität Marburg recommends a minimum level of B1, as defined by the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (CEFR), in the language of instruction. A level of B2 is advisable. In philology courses the language of instruction is often the language of the region studied.

Language requirements for individual faculties or areas of study that differ from this general recommendation are specified in the Inter-institutional agreement.

Additional information / requirements

At Philipps-Universität Marburg (D MARBURG01), intensive language courses are offered before each semester; orientation weeks for Incoming students are held twice before each semester (before and after the language courses).

Philipps-Universität Marburg (D MARBURG01) has infrastructures to host students and staff with disabilities (accommodation, classroom access, etc.), though not all university buildings are barrier-free. Depending on the nature of the disability, the city infrastructure may not be adequate.
