Grading system

Students at Universidad Isabel I have two grading options during the ordinary examination session. It is essential that students choose one of the options before the due deadline.

Students must obtain a mark of at least a 4 in both parts in order to calculate the average. The final grade, average of both marks, must be greater or equal than 5.

Grading System	
Continuous assessment 60% - 40%	60% of the final grade is made up with the exercises and homework assigned during the course. 40% is the final exam which must be taken face-to-face.
Competency Evaluation Task 50% - 50%	50% of the final grade is made up by a multi-part assignment due at the end of the course. 50% is the final exam which must be taken face-to-face.
