Academic structure

Subjects are organized in groups between 20 and 40 students per class. This entails a limitation of subjects' places for students (exchange and non-exchange). It also entails a well-structured course program.

Students do not have a permanent own space in the faculty (individual studio spaces), neither a workshop dedicated exclusively to the students' single work. However, they can use the workshops (metal and woodwork, painting, foundry, photo set, etc.), with the authorization of a teacher.

As student, you are expected to attend all the classes, as attendance is mandatory. During the first day of class, teachers will explain the course program, that may include theoretical sessions, in-class assignments, home assignments or exams. You can check the complete course guide at the site of each Bachelor program.

Selection criteria

A portfolio is required (except for conservation students). To be uploaded to AIRE.

Once the application deadline is over, the International Office selects students' applications based on:

- 1-Places availability
- 2-Balance & reciprocity of exchanges
- 3-Portfolio
- 4-Spanish language Skills

- Course selection made on application stage is merely for informative purposes. Students will be able to do a definitive registration in subjects two months before their arrival to UPV.

- Subjects in the area of animation, illustration or photography have few places for exchange students. Students are encouraged to consider alternative options in case of being rejected.

- Tuition in Spanish. It is highly recommended to achieve a B1 level before arrival to UPV. More info on language requirements at: link

APPLICATION PERIODS AND DEADLINES

Period of studies in UPV

Step 2 (validation of request to get username and PIN) may take several days.

Step 4 will require a signature from your home university on a PDF file

4 STEPS TO APPLY

Manage all the steps of your application with our online portal [AIRE](#)

Step 1. Your home university sends your nomination using an [online nomination form](#)

Step 2. Request Username and PIN number

This step is not automatic, a member of staff has to approve each request (only possible if Step 1 has been completed)

Step 3. Complete [the online application](#) form on the AIRE portal.

Step 4. Download and print the overview of your online application. Obtain signatures and upload it, along with any documents requested by your UPV host School / Faculty, as explained in the application instructions you will receive.

Selecting your courses (!)

AVERAGE COURSE LOAD PER SEMESTER 25/30 ECTS

(around 4 to 5 courses).

- When you start your online application, you will have to select one host School / Faculty. Students from European institutions must chose the same School they have been nominated for by their home university (defined by the Erasmus agreements in place)
- Applicants must take the majority of credits (courses/projects) in their host School / Faculty.
- Maximum number of credits that you can select from a different UPV School / Faculty: 12 ECTS (semester) or 24 ECTS (full academic year) for a full workload of 30 / 60 ECTS.
- Students applying for the Alcoy campus (EPSA School) are not allowed to select courses from the other two campuses.
- Some Schools may have some pre-requisites for certain courses or restricted degrees. Insufficient background may result in course denial. [See the list of course restrictions](#)
- An acceptance letter or email, or even a signed Erasmus Learning Agreement is not a guarantee of registration in each of your courses. It is only a preliminary OK.
- You will reconfirm your choice of courses and timetable choices at the beginning of the semester. You will receive further information about the course registration (*matrícula*) during the pre-arrival stage

TIPS TO SELECT YOUR COURSES

- Take a look at the structure of the [degrees and the content of the courses](#).
- Make sure your pre-selected courses are taught in the right semester (A, B, or full-year).
- Creating a study programme with English courses taught in several UPV Schools is not a good idea. Focus mainly on the courses available in your host School.
- Think of alternative options in case of changes in your preliminary course list (timetable overlaps, course is full or unavailable..). Our course offer is huge, so don't panic!

Spanish and English as Tuition Languages

Our main language of instruction (for degree and exchange students) is Spanish. UPV offers some courses in English, with a limited capacity of enrollment. Some UPV Schools offer a larger number of English courses than others.

We often have more applicants than seats available in English-taught courses and we cannot always guarantee enrollment. We prioritize students from non-European institutions. A good level of Spanish and flexibility in your choices will make things easier.

Language requirements vary slightly depending on your exchange program and your host UPV School or Faculty. In most cases (but not all) the required level is B1 of Spanish to enroll in courses taught in Spanish and level B2 of English to enroll in courses taught in English. PRE-SEMESTER INTENSIVE LANGUAGE COURSE (GANDIA CAMPUS)

Fee Paying

40 hours - 4 ECTS / Levels from A1 to C2

SPANISH LANGUAGE COURSES

Free of charge for exchange students

4,5 ECTS each semester

Level A1: only for students from Asian universities

Levels A2-B2 (Alcoy campus only B1)

Mentor (Buddy) Program

Buddy Program aims at partnering UPV students with incoming exchange students from the same School.

Buddy partners can help with daily life questions, as well as with administrative and academic issues during the stay.

Visa

Non EU-EFTA/EEA nationals must obtain a visa to enter Spanish territory and it is their responsibility to maintain lawful status during their stay

Accommodation

UPV does not provide accommodation for exchange students, but it is usually easy to find housing in private apartments near our 3 campuses any time of the year. A number of websites and companies specialize in short-term accommodation for students and international visitors.

For housing in student dorms, we recommend you book well in advance.

SHARING OR RENTING AN APARTMENT

This is the most common choice among exchange students.

Price: from 250 to 350€ for a single room + utilities (electricity, gas, internet, etc).

STUDENT DORMITORIES

There are many student dorms around our Campuses.

Prices: around 600 to 700€ with meal plans.
