PRACTICAL INFORMATION

Entry Regulations

Citizens of a EU member state, the EEA (European Economic Area), Switzerland, Monaco and Andorra do not require visas to study and work in France.

Visas & Residence / Work permits

Residence permit (for stays longer than 12 months)

Our Student Administration Office will help you get your Residence permit once you have arrived on campus and will organize all the appointments with the French administration in order for you to obtain your permit.

The incoming students are responsible for paying for and obtaining the visa on time and any costs associated.

Warning: bring originals AND copies of the requested documents. All official documents will have to be translated by a sworn translator officially certified and designated by the French courts or by a consular authority.

Insurance

The **health care insurance** is **mandatory** for all students in France.

- EU students: the European Health Card is sufficient.
- Non-EU students: they must subscribe to the French Social Security system (€215 runs for one year, not divisible per semester). The Student Administration Office will assist degree-seeking students for purchasing the health care insurance at their arrival. Please note that some grant holders are exempted from paying the subscription (refer to your granting institution). Non-degree seeking students coming for one single semester might have their own health care insurance (a copy of the contract must be given to the Student Administration Office).

In addition, a **complete insurance coverage** is mandatory for accommodation, personal liability and belongings (can be subscribed when arriving).

Housing



On-campus accommodation is available for International students. Applications will be open to students after their official admission.
