The laboratories are structured according to either disciplinary fields or targeted research topics, cultural areas or socio-economic area. Students may benefit from the rich research environment at our university by attending conferences and seminars organized by our laboratories. Libraries and collections	With a two main library on each campus, as well as fourteen specialized libraries, the University Lumière Lyon 2 has a collection well over 450 000 books.
