Social Security

Incoming students from EU, EEA, Switzerland: European Health Insurance card or proof of private health insurance coverage (with no limitations) for the duration of the stay is required.

Non-EU: duration of the stay is less than 3 months: proof of private health insurance coverage (with no limitations) for the duration of the stay.

The duration of the stay exceeds 3 months: enrollment in the French Student Social Security system is mandatory. Before coming to France for your studies, you need to enrol in the French social security system by applying via the dedicated website https://etudiant-etranger.ameli.fr/#/

Visa requirements

EU, EEA, Switzerland, Monaco, Andorra: a valid ID card or passport is sufficient.

Non-EU: valid passport + visa obtained in the home country, usually a long-stay visa (depending on the duration of the stay) to be validated on-line upon arrival (first 3 months)

5. LIVING EXPENSES

This is only an estimate of the costs students will have to support for everyday life in Lyon; some costs are subject to change!

Housing fees

- Saint Bernard and Saint Laurent Houses: Long Stays (more than 6 months): 393€ / month + electricity (15€). Short stay (less than 6 months): 408€ / month + electricity (15€).
- A room, studio or flat in the city: room is the owner's house: from 350€ (including charges), shared apartment: from 400€/ month (excluding charges) a studio or flat: from 550€ / month (excluding charges)
- Lodging with a host family: from 670€ / month
- Private student residences: from 540€ / month

Other expenses

Monthly electricity, gas and telephone bill: 60€ on average

City transport: 14.80€ [metro, tram, bus] for a book of 10 tickets or monthly subscription 32.50€

Vélov: 17€ / year

Food: about 200€ a month

Lunch at the university cafeteria is around 4€.

Diner at a nice restaurant: 20€

A baquette: 1€

A movie ticket: 6 or 7€ (student price)
