Admission criteria:	Applicants will be selected on the basis of: the complete application documents, the chosen study programme, the portfolio and the balance between incoming /outgoing students (reciprocity of exchanges).	
Acceptance	Each student will receive an individual acceptance letter, by e-mail, within two weeks or, at the latest, within a month after the deadline. Please take into consideration that the students who apply for the Restoration course, a rigorous selection is foreseen, due to the limited number of available places. It's strongly recommended a very high knowledge of the Italian language (B1 at least) besides, the applicant are requested to send a Curriculum containing the work made and the competences acquired on practical activities of Restoration. In our Academy the students work on Archeological goods, protected by the Cultural and Archeological State Authorities, so incoming students can practically work on these goods only if they can demonstrate preceding specific competences, which will examine by the Coordinator of the course.

The Italian University and Academic system is based on 3 + 2 years;

1st cycle/level = 3 years (Triennio = undergraduate, BA)

2nd cycle /level = 2 years (Biennio = postgraduate, MA)

- DECORATION (1st and 2nd level)
- PAINTING (1st and 2nd level)
- SCENOGRAPHY (1st and 2nd level)
- SCULPTURE (1st and 2nd level)
- GRAPHICS (1st level)
- PHOTOGRAPHY (1st level)
- ART GRAPHICS AND PROJECTING (2nd level)
- RESTORATION (one five course level)

Please take into consideration that the Erasmus students can choose classes in different main courses of the same level degree, in order to arrange their optimal planes of study and to update their Learning Agreement, in the section "During the mobility".
