Admission requirements	<p>Once the students receive their selection e-mail, they will be provided with all the information about their admission process and they will be required to provide the following documents:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • National Identity Document or Passport (valid for the whole period of their stay) • Medical insurance, including repatriation and international medical evacuation costs (valid for the whole period of their stay) • Learning Agreement filled in with the courses to be undertaken at our university. Find more information about available courses in the official catalogue. <p>Once the documents have been examined and validated, the student will be admitted and will receive his/her Acceptance Letter.</p>

Immigration procedures	<p>Before arrival:</p> <p>Citizens of states not belonging to the European Union, the European Economic Area or Switzerland must apply for a student visa.</p> <p>Upon arrival:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Citizens of member states of the European Union, the European Economic Area or Switzerland must register at the Central Register for Foreign Nationals. • Citizens of states not belonging to the European Union, the European Economic Area or Switzerland: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ◦ If their stay is of less than 6 months, they must register at the Central Register for Foreign Nationals. ◦ If their stay is of over 6 months, they must apply for a Foreigner Identity Card. <p>More information about these procedures can be found at our Welcome Guide.</p>
Insurance	<p>For their temporary stay in Italy, students from the EU must get the European Health Insurance Card (EHIC) before leaving their countries.</p> <p>All exchange students/professors/staff visiting the University of Salento in the framework of any international mobility programme or bilateral agreement are required to have an insurance policy covering the following eventualities:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Accident • Illness (international medical evacuation inclusive) • Repatriation in case of death

Mentor Programme	<p>University of Salento offers one-to-one support to incoming students before and during their stay.</p>
Students with disabilities/chronic diseases	<p>The Disability Integration Office or Inclusive Education Office at the University of Salento has the role of facilitating university studies for students with disabilities; offering help, guidance and information.</p> <p>Paola Martino, Advisor for Students with Disabilities and Chronic Diseases, centro.sostegno@unisalento.it</p> <p>The University of Salento is not based in one single campus, but spread throughout the city. However, similar study areas are usually concentrated in one area. As many institutes are located in older buildings, not all of them are barrier-free. Therefore, students are recommended to get in touch with us before their arrival for further information.</p>
Studying and learning supports	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Special conditions and support in the different libraries - Specially equipped room for taking exams, including reading devices - Mentoring (on demand) <p>Special conditions for exams (e.g. different form of exam, more time, permission of supporting tools etc.) can be arranged depending on degree of disability and needs. Students should discuss this well in advance either with their Erasmus Departmental Coordinator or the advisor for students with disabilities, Mrs Paola Martino.</p>

LIVING IN LECCE

Living	<p>Lecce, the grand dame of Puglia, is a dazzling city all dolled up in baroque embellishments.
