Academic system	<p>Credits:</p> <p><u>1 local credit (CFU) = 1 ECTS credit.</u></p> <p>1 CFU corresponds to 25 hours of work including lectures, laboratories, seminars, individual studies ect...</p> <p>Workload for incoming students is set out by sending institutions. As a general guidance, the average workload for 1 year full time studies is 60 CFU</p> <p>Grading system:</p> <p>The Italian grading scale runs from 0 to 30. Minimum score to pass an exam is 18; the maximum is 30 e lode (<i>cum laude</i>, "with distinction").</p>
