Italian language course	Before the beginning of each term, the University of Salerno organizes intensive
	Italian language courses free of charge for all incoming students. The aim is to
	give students a basic competence in Italian in order to guarantee them a better
	understanding of courses. After attending the course, students will receive a
	certificate with a final mark and 12 credits, if they pass the test.

	RESIDENCE PERMIT
EU / EEA citizens	No requirements
Non-EU citizens	As soon as the application procedure is concluded, non UE students will receive
	the invitation letter by the University of Salerno
	The invitation letter will enable non UE students to contact the Italian Embassy
	or Consulate to obtain the VISA.
	Before leaving for Italy non EU students must have:
	- a valid passport;
	- the Visa issued by the Embassy or Consulate;
	- the insurance covering them from health problems and accidents for
	the whole period of their stay.
	All the above-mentioned documents will enable students to set up the
	procedure to apply for a residence permit (Permesso di soggiorno), which is
	compulsory. Students will be charged about € 80 for this residence permit.
