General Semester Dates (differ by year and program)	Autumn: Beginning of September to End of January Spring: Beginning of February to End of July
Nominations Open	1 February: Autumn semester and full year 1 August: Spring semester
Nominations Procedure	In order to be considered for exchange, you have to be nominated by your home institution. Please contact your Erasmus/ Exchange co-ordinator for this. The nomination procedure requires your full name, your email address, the name of your university and the name of the programme with which you would like to do your exchange at THUAS.
Nominations Deadline	30 April: Autumn Semester and full year 15 October: Spring Semester
Applications Open	1 April: Autumn Semester and full year 1 October: Spring Semester
Applications Procedure	When your home university has nominated you and THUAS has accepted you, you will be contacted by our International Office in order to complete the application process. You will receive an email with information and the steps and documents required of you during your application, so please make sure that your inbox has space and that the email you supplied during the nomination process is correct.
Applications Deadline	31 May: Autumn semester and full year 15 November: Spring semester
Immigration Documents & Applicable Payment(s) Deadline	15 June: Autumn semester and full year 30 November: Spring semester

Course Registration	The course registration depends on the programme you have applied for. For some of the programmes you need to submit a subject choice form.														
Language(s) of Instruction	Subjects offered to exchange students are taught in English														
Language Proficiency	The Hague University of Applied Sciences does not require a language test but relies on its partner institutions to evaluate their student's English proficiency and make sure that the level is sufficient to cope with the study programme. A specific minimum level of English may be specified in the exchange agreement between your home institution and THUAS.														
Grading System	Each module or subject taught at The Hague University of Applied Sciences is worth a number of ECTS. One ECTS credit represents 28 hours of full-time study.
