	KTH Accommodation rents rooms for exchange students in student housing buildings (dormitories). Rooms are also rented in apartment houses. The rooms are located in central Stockholm as well as in the suburbs of the city. KTH offers this service to international students as the housing market is extremely difficult in Stockholm. The location of the room will depend on the number of rooms available at the moment. There is no possibility to choose your room or address, nor to change rooms!
	Exchange students must apply for accommodation on the web-application form for exchange studies. This form is sent to the international coordinator of the chosen program at KTH. A housing confirmation is sent to the student before arrival in Sweden but the housing contract is signed upon arrival at KTH.

# PRESENTATION OF THE INSTITUTION

KTH is Sweden's leading technical university and provides undergraduate and postgraduate courses in architecture, engineering and technology. In addition, KTH offers a broad range of Master's programmes. Since KTH is a technical research university, courses always include the latest developments within the subject at hand.

The main campus is located in central Stockholm. The duration of the programmes is either one or two years. The programmes consist of course work followed by a degree project.
