ACADEMIC Erasmus+ students must choose 75% of their modules from the department in which we have the agreement with your university.

Other students should take 50% of their modules within one subject area.

## **Course Availability**

• Psychology courses are only available for Psychology-specific exchange partners

## **Module Availability**

Where possible modules will be allocated near to your arrival, but will need to be finalised upon arrival and registration. There is a module change period during the first two weeks of each semester.

- TRANSCRIPTS Semester 1 transcripts are sent out in early March Full Year and Semester 2 transcripts are sent out in July Two copies will be sent directly to your home university.
  - FINANCE Exchange students will have their tuition fee waived. Fee-paying students can find information on their tuition rate on the Inbound website.

<u>Living expenses</u> vary depending on lifestyle choices. As a guide, please budget around £1015 a month to cover expenses.

HOUSING You cannot apply for university accommodation until your application has been approved

Full Year at all campuses You are guaranteed housing if you apply by 31st July.

#### Semester at Penryn Campus

You are guaranteed housing if you apply by 31st July.

#### Semester at Exeter Campuses

There are limited university-owned rooms for students studying for one semester. The majority will seek accommodation in the private sector. A list of privately-owned or managed houses can be found on the <u>Accommodation webpage</u>.

More semester accommodation is available in Semester 2

- VISA Currently non-EU/EEA passport holders will need to <u>apply for a visa to</u> <u>study in the UK</u>.
