## Winter School on European Politics and Economy

### Overview

Target group	The IES winter school is designed for undergraduate and graduate students from all countries with any kind of academic background. The courses aim at students who wish to gain a basic knowledge of Europe and the European Union with a focus on politics, history and the economy. Participants must be at least 18 years old.
Description/content	The International & European Studies (IES) winter school offers seminars on European politics and economy as well as courses on German language and intercultural competence.  Peace, power-sharing, the rule of law, and freedom constitute pivotal values for Europe and the European Union (EU). The winter school places these four basic values at the core of its academic courses. Through classes and study trips, the participants will have the opportunity to explore, further investigate, and discuss these basic European principles – which can be seen as the cornerstones of more than 60 years of European Integration.  The courses are complemented by a varied leisure programme. The "buddy programme" supports the development of the participants' intercultural sensitivity and competence.  Academic courses (taught in English):  • The European Union - Institutions, Politics, and History: This course will introduce students to the EU as a political system, characterised by the principal of the separation of powers. Students will learn about the significant executive, legislative, and judicial powers of the EU, and the course will also cover how policies are made in this unique multi-layered system of governance.  • Regional Economic Integration - The Case of the European UnionAfter a brief introduction to the topic of international business, students will learn about trade and trade restriction mechanisms. Afterwards, a focus will be placed on regional economic integration and its effects on doing business, with the European Union as the example of the highest level of integration.

- Strasbourg: European Parliament (one day)
- Berlin: Historic centre and government district (three days)
- Frankfurt: European Central Bank (one day)
- Stuttgart: Baden-Württemberg International (one day)

### German language course:

 Conversation, writing, reading, grammar at different levels of proficiency (A1-B2) (Participants do not have to have any prior knowledge of German.)

### Intercultural workshop:

• Intercultural communication, reflection on study abroad experience and learning process

### **Buddy programme:**

 Students from the University of Tübingen support the IES participants before and during their stay in Tübingen. The buddy programme promotes intercultural exchange and will allow participants to get to know German student life first-hand.
